What is our proposal to address non-payment?

- 1. Implementation of statutory trust accounts to protect subcontractors against insolvency;
- 2. Simplified reference dates so that they arise expressly once a month and post-termination;
- 3. Changes to definitions, including a change to the definition of work so that retention money can be recovered;
- 4. Changes to ensure disputed variations are easier to recover;
- 5. Changes to the definition of 'Excluded Amounts'
